**LIVINGSTON COUNTY PROPOSAL**

Livingston County

Renewal of the County Veterans Services Program Millage Proposal

For the purpose of continuing to fund dedicated services and programs to Livingston County veterans of active United States military service and their dependents, including providing funding for the County Department of Veterans' Services, shall the constitutional limitation on general ad valorem taxes which may be assessed in any one (1) year upon all property within the County of Livingston, Michigan, be renewed by up to 0.1117 of one (1) mill (\$0.1117 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value) for a period of six (6) years, from 2028 through 2033, inclusive.

If approved and levied in full, this millage will raise an estimated \$1,600,000 in the first calendar year of the levy. As required by law, a small portion of the millage may also be disbursed to the Downtown Development Authorities of the City of Howell and the Village of Fowlerville; the Tax Increment Finance Authority of the City of Howell; and the Local Development Finance Authority of the Village of Fowlerville.

**COHOCTAH TOWNSHIP PROPOSAL**

Cohoctah Township

Road Millage Proposal

Shall Cohoctah Township, Livingston County, Michigan, be authorized to levy a millage annually in an amount not to exceed 1.5 mills (\$1.50 per each \$1,000 of taxable value), of which 1.4677 mills is a renewal of the previously authorized millage that expires in 2026 and .0323 mill is new additional millage to restore the millage rate lost as a result of the Headlee Amendment millage reductions, against all taxable property in the Township for a period of four (4) years, 2027 through 2030, inclusive, for the purpose of constructing, preserving, improving, repairing, controlling dust, and maintaining roads in the Township? The estimate of the revenue the Township will collect in the first year (2027) if the millage is approved and levied by the Township is approximately \$259,000.

**HAMBURG TOWNSHIP PROPOSAL**

Hamburg Township

Police Millage

Shall Hamburg Township be authorized to levy a tax annually upon the taxable value of all property in the township subject to ad valorem taxation for the purpose of providing funds for the operation of police services in the township in an amount not to exceed 3.00 mills (\$3.00 on each \$1000.00 of taxable value) for a period of ten (10) years, 2026 to 2035 inclusive? If approved by the voters, the new millage will commence and the previously voter-approved police millage of 2.50 mills (\$2.50 on each \$1000.00 of taxable value) which has been rolled back by the Headlee Amendment millage reduction to 2.3717 mills (\$2.3717 on each \$1000.00 of taxable value) will be terminated. If approved by the voters, the estimated revenue that would be raised in the first year of the millage is \$4,636,352.79.

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LIVINGSTON (47)****HARTLAND TOWNSHIP PROPOSAL**

Hartland Township  
Fire Millage Proposal

Shall the tax limitation on all taxable property within Hartland Township, Livingston County, Michigan, be increased and the Township be authorized to levy annually, a new millage in the amount of 2.3 mills (\$2.30 per \$1,000 of taxable value), for five years, 2026 to 2030 inclusive, to provide funds for operating, equipping, constructing and purchasing for the Hartland Deerfield Fire Authority or for any other purpose authorized by law for fire service purposes? The estimated revenue the Township will collect in the first year of levy (2026) if the millage is approved is approximately \$2,489,835. (This proposal represents an authorization to levy a millage greater than the previously authorized number of mills (2.06 mills) reduced by the required millage rollbacks and which expired in 2025, and an increase of 0.24 mill).

**HOWELL TOWNSHIP PROPOSAL**

Howell Township  
Road Millage Renewal Proposal

To renew .8976 mill (\$.8976 per \$1,000 of taxable value) (the previously authorized 1.0 mill levy reduced by the required millage rollback) for the improvement and maintenance of public roads in Howell Township for a period of four years beginning January 1, 2027 and ending December 31, 2030.

Shall the previous limitation on the total amount of taxes that may be assessed against all property in the Township of Howell, County of Livingston, State of Michigan, as provided by Section 6, Article 9, of the Constitution of the State of Michigan, in the amount of 1 mill (\$1 per \$1,000 per taxable valuation) for a renewal period of four (4) years, commencing January 1, 2027 through December 31, 2030; the proceeds of the levy thereof to be used for the funding of the improvement and maintenance of public roads in the Township of Howell, Livingston County, State of Michigan, which renewal will raise in the first year of such levy an estimated \$495,000?

**VILLAGE OF FOWLerville PROPOSAL**

Village of Fowlerville  
Mosquito Control Program Millage Proposal

For the purpose of reauthorizing funding to continue the Village's Mosquito Control Program, shall the authorized millage of the Village of Fowlerville upon taxable real and tangible personal property within said Village, be increased, and shall the Village be authorized to levy, up to 0.7500 of one (1) mill (\$0.7500 per \$1,000 of taxable value) for a period of four (4) years, 2027 through 2030, inclusive?

If approved and levied in full, this millage will raise an estimated \$45,000 for the Village's Mosquito Control Program in the first year of the levy, based on taxable value. As required by law, a small portion of the millage may also be disbursed to the Fowlerville Downtown Development Authority and Local Development Finance Authority.

**FOWLerville COMMUNITY SCHOOLS PROPOSAL**

Fowlerville Community Schools  
Operating Millage Renewal Proposal

This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the statutory rate of not to exceed 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its full revenue per pupil foundation allowance. The remaining 0.5337 mill is only available to be levied to restore millage lost as a reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963 and will only be levied to the extent necessary to restore that reduction.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Fowlerville Community Schools, Livingston, Ingham and Shiawassee Counties, Michigan, be increased by 18.5337 mills (\$18.5337 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 4 years, 2027 to 2030, inclusive, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and 18 mills are levied in 2027 is approximately \$3,782,870 (this is a renewal of millage that expired with the 2026 tax levy)?

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**MORRICE AREA SCHOOLS PROPOSAL**

Morrice Area Schools  
Operating Millage Proposal

This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the statutory rate of not to exceed 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Morrice Area Schools, Shiawassee, Livingston and Ingham Counties, Michigan, be increased by 18 mills (\$18.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 10 years, 2027 to 2036, inclusive, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and 18 mills are levied in 2027 is approximately \$497,638?

**PINCKNEY COMMUNITY SCHOOLS PROPOSAL**

Pinckney Community Schools  
Operating Millage Renewal Proposal

This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the statutory rate of not to exceed 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance. The remaining 2.2839 mills are only available to be levied to restore millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963 and will only be levied to the extent necessary to restore that reduction.

Shall the currently authorized millage rate limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Pinckney Community Schools, Livingston and Washtenaw Counties, Michigan, be renewed by 20.2839 mills (\$20.2839 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 10 years, 2027 to 2036, inclusive, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and 18 mills are levied in 2027 is approximately \$5,505,761 (this is a renewal of millage that will expire with the 2026 tax levy)?

**WHITMORE LAKE PUBLIC SCHOOLS PROPOSAL**

Whitmore Lake Public School District Sinking Fund Millage Renewal Proposal

This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the building and site sinking fund millage that expires with the 2027 tax levy.

Shall the currently authorized millage rate of .9345 mill (\$0.9345 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) which may be assessed against all property in Whitmore Lake Public School District, Washtenaw and Livingston Counties, Michigan, be renewed for a period of 10 years, 2028 to 2037, inclusive, to continue to provide for a sinking fund for the purchase of real estate for sites for and the construction or repair of school buildings; for school security improvements; for the acquisition or upgrading of technology; and all other purposes authorized by law; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2028 is approximately \$592,302 (this is a renewal of millage that will expire with the 2027 tax levy)?

### **OAKLAND SCHOOLS PROPOSAL**

Oakland Schools Intermediate School District Regional Enhancement Millage Proposal

Oakland Schools Intermediate School District  
State of Michigan

Pursuant to state law, revenue raised by this proposed regional enhancement millage will be collected by the Oakland Schools Intermediate School District and distributed on an equal per-pupil basis to local public school districts and eligible public school academies within the boundaries of the Oakland Schools Intermediate School District.

Shall the limitation on the amount of ad valorem taxes which may be imposed on taxable property in the Oakland Schools Intermediate School District, State of Michigan, be increased by 1.5 mills (\$1.50 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of six (6) years, 2026 to 2031, inclusive, as new additional millage to provide funds to enhance other state and local funding for public school operating purposes? This millage would raise an estimated \$125,756,247 if approved and first levied in 2026.

The revenue from this regional enhancement millage will be disbursed on an equal per-pupil basis to the following listed school districts and public school academies within the boundaries of Oakland Schools Intermediate School District which are eligible to receive regional enhancement millage revenue under the Revised School Code:

Avondale School District; The Lamphere Schools; Berkley School District; Madison District Public Schools; Birmingham Public Schools; Novi Community School District; Bloomfield Hills Schools; Oak Park Schools; Brandon School District; Oxford Community Schools; Clarenceville School District; Pontiac School District; Clarkston Community Schools; Rochester Community Schools; Clawson Public Schools; Royal Oak Schools; Farmington Public Schools; South Lyon Community Schools; Ferndale Public Schools; Southfield Public Schools; Hazel Park Schools; Troy School District; Holly Area Schools; Walled Lake Consolidated Schools; Huron Valley Schools; Waterford School District; Lake Orion Community Schools; West Bloomfield School District

### **PINCKNEY COMMUNITY PUBLIC LIBRARY PROPOSAL**

Pinckney Community Public Library  
Library Millage Proposal

Shall the Pinckney Community Public Library, County of Livingston, State of Michigan, be authorized to levy a millage annually in an amount not to exceed 1.75 mills (\$1.75 per each \$1,000 of taxable value), of which 1.3895 mills is a renewal of the previously authorized millage rate that expires in 2026 and .3605 mill is new additional millage, against all taxable property within the Pinckney Community Public Library district for a period of eight (8) years, 2027 through 2034, inclusive, for the purpose of providing funds for all district library purposes authorized by law? The estimate of the revenue the Pinckney Community Public Library will collect in the first year of levy (2027) if the millage is approved and levied by the Library is approximately \$960,000.
