Travel Advisory - Chilson Road Bridge over I-96 Closure

The Michigan Department of Transportation has closed the Chilson Road Bridge across I-96 in each direction to rebuild the bridge. The closure began Monday March 3 and is projected to reopen on Friday August 1.

Traffic will be detoured via Latson Road and Grand River Avenue.

Free Yard Waste Drop-offs for Residents

Our Spring Yard Waste Collection program has been scheduled for the following dates at the Genoa Charter Township Hall from 8-11 a.m. on the following dates:

Saturday May 3 Saturday June 7 Residents may bring their yard waste to the Township Hall Parking lot. Branches and similar materials must be in 3 foot long bundles.

Please no plastic bags.

Curbside yard waste service through Waste Management

Genoa Township residents can sign up for bi-weekly curbside yard waste collection through Waste Management. There is a charge for this service.

To sign up and pay for curbside yard waste service, call Waste Management at (810) 201-5576 and enter your zip code when asked for an account number.

Bulk Item FAQ

- Waste Management will take one bulk item from every household every week.
- These are items that do not fit in your garbage cart. Examples furniture, TVs, washing machines, etc.
- Excess garbage bags or recycling is not bulk.
- Fabric items must be completely wrapped in plastic.
- Bulk should be placed out the night before your collection day, about 3 feet from your garbage cart.
- Bulk items are collected by a special truck and must stay at the curb. Collection can take up to five business days. If no pickup after five days, call the Township. We will contact WM on your behalf.

• Yard waste is not bulk and cannot be put into your regular trash or recycling. Contact Waste Management at (810) 201-5576 with yard waste questions.

Recycle Right – 2 Most Common Mistakes

The Township contract with Waste Management includes weekly collection of 64 gallons of recycling. To make sure you are recycling right, please note these two basic rules and visit <u>Recycle Right®</u> for more information on recycling.

Rule 1 – Keep it Clean: Only empty and clean containers can be recycled. Plastics, cans, containers, glass and cardboard must be clean, dry and free of food waste before you place them in your recycle container. The goal is to make sure they are clean enough to avoid contaminating other materials, like paper, or your un-lined kitchen recycling bin. Try using a spatula to scrape cans and jars, and putting recyclables in your sink among the dishes you are rinsing to share that same water to rinse and remove residue. **SPECIAL NOTE FOR PIZZA BOXES** – Pizza boxes should be grease free. Remove the liner and any leftover food.

Rule 2 – No Bags: No loose plastic bags, bagged recyclables, shopping bags or other film. These non-recyclable items contaminate recyclables. Reuse plastic bags, or learn where you can recycle them at <u>plasticfilmrecycling.org</u>.

Grand River Avenue, south of Grand River Avenue, east of Grand Oaks Drive. The request is submitted at KN West, LLC..
- Chase Drive-up ATM Relocation: request is for the relocation of the existing drive-up ATM in parking lot located at 3599 E. Grand River Avenue, north side of Grand River Avenue, west of Latson Road. The request is submitted by Symmetry Management.
