## GENOA CHARTER TOWNSHIP BOARD Regular Meeting May 15, 2023

#### **MINUTES**

Supervisor Rogers called the regular meeting of the Genoa Charter Township Board to order at 6:30 pm at the Township Hall. The following members were present constituting a quorum for the transaction of business: Bill Rogers, Jean Ledford, Terry Croft, Diana Lowe, Robin Hunt, Paulette Skolarus, and Jim Mortensen. Also present were Township Manager Kelly VanMarter, and 10 people in the audience.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The call to the public was opened at 6:31 pm.

Mr. Kurt Skarjune of 2787 Monte Vista advised that today is the first day of police week and it honors officers who were killed in the line of duty. He did a ride along with the Livingston County Sheriff and it confirmed his belief that the law enforcement presence in the Township is inadequate. He made a post on the Nextdoor App, and it has 10,000 views. He encouraged the Board Members to do a ride along as well. He wants the Township to contract with the Livingston County Sheriff's Department.

The call to the public was closed at 6:34 pm.

### **Approval of Consent Agenda:**

Ms. Skolarus requested to have Agenda Item #2 moved to the Regular Agenda.

**Moved** by Skolarus, supported by Lowe, to approve the Consent Agenda as amended. **The motion carried unanimously**.

- 2. Request to approve May 1, 2023 regular meeting minutes. (moved to Regular Agenda)

#### Regular Agenda

**Moved** by Ledford, supported by Mortensen, to approve the Regular Agenda as amended. **The motion carried unanimously**.

2. Request to approve May 1, 2023 regular meeting minutes.

Ms. Skolarus asked to have it noted at the top of the minutes what time Jim Mortensen arrived at the meeting, to bold the agenda items so they are easier to see, and to note that Mr. Mortensen was absent in the roll call votes before he arrived.

**Moved** by Skolarus, seconded by Hunt to approve the May 1, 2023 regular agenda minutes as corrected.

- 3. Public Hearing on the proposed Special Assessment Roll for the Stillriver Drive Road Rehabilitation Special Assessment Project (Summer Tax 2023).
  - A. Call to the Property Owners
  - B. Call to the Public

The call to the property owners was opened at 6:36 pm.

Mr. Mike Luce of 3039 Stillriver Drive thanked the Board for facilitating this project. He noted almost all the property owners are in favor of it. Kelly VanMarter has been instrumental in helping them, and she is a pleasure to work with.

Ms. Joan Darnell of 3052 Stillriver Drive is not in favor of the project as she does not have the means to pay. These are public roads, and she does not understand why they have to be funded privately. She feels like this is being pushed through. Supervisor Rogers noted that Ms. Darnell also sent an email to the Township voicing her concerns.

Mr. Ben Luethy of 3019 Stillriver Drive is in favor of this project.

The call to the property owners was closed at 6:41 pm.

The call to the public was opened at 6:41 pm with no response.

4. Request for approval of Resolution #5 Confirming the Special Assessment Roll for the Stillriver Drive Road Rehabilitation Special Assessment Project (Summer Tax 2023). (Roll Call)

Ms. Skolarus questioned the Township's policy for residents who are unable to pay for the assessment.

Ms. Hunt stated there is a hardship deferral, which would not require the current owner to pay the assessment. It would remain on the taxes, and it would be paid for by the next owner.

**Moved** by Ledford, supported by Croft, to approve Resolution #5 Confirming the Special Assessment Roll for the Stillriver Drive Road Rehabilitation Special Assessment Project (Summer Tax 2023). **The motion carried unanimously with a roll call vote (Ledford - yes, Croft - yes, Hunt - yes, Lowe - yes, Mortensen - yes, Skolarus - yes, and Rogers - yes).** 

5. Consideration of amendments to the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 budget for Fund 202 – "SAD Roads and Lakes" to create a new Department #494 with associated revenue and appropriation line items for the Stillriver Drive Special Assessment project as submitted by the Township Manager.

**Moved** by Skolarus, supported by Lowe, to approve amendments to the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 budget for Fund 202 – "SAD Roads and Lakes" to create a new Department #494 with associated revenue and appropriation line items for the Stillriver Drive Special Assessment project as submitted by the Township Manager. **The motion carried unanimously.** 

6. Request for approval of an Addendum to the Alcohol and Drug Free Workplace Policy for CDL Licensing.

Mr. Tatara provided a review for the reason for the update to this policy.

Mr. Croft stated he is not in favor of the \$2,000 bonus for employees having a CDL.

**Moved** by Skolarus, supported by Lowe, to approve the Addendum to the Alcohol and Drug Free Workplace Policy for CDL Licensing as presented. **The motion carried (Ledford - yes, Croft - no, Hunt - yes, Lowe - yes, Mortensen - yes, Skolarus - yes, and Rogers - yes).** 

7. Consideration of a recommendation for approval of the environmental impact assessment corresponding to an amended Final PUD grading plan for proposed site grading located at 7575 Grand River, Brighton. The request is petitioned by Tom Tocco, Trinity Health.

Mr. Tom Tocco of Trinity Health and Mr. Dino Lekas of Smith Group, the landscape architect, were present. Mr. Tocco stated the suggestions that were made at the Planning Commission meeting have been addressed.

Mr. Smith Group provided a review of the project, which is to now maintain the graded soil on the property to allow for the future installation of a community garden.

**Moved** by Ledford, supported by Lowe, to approve the Environmental Impact Assessment dated February 24, 2023 corresponding to the revised amended final PUD grading plan (5-8-23) for the previously approved Trinity Health Hospital Addition located at 7575 Grand River Avenue. **The motion carried unanimously**.

8. Request for amendment to Resolution #5 to extend the interest free pre-payment period from May 17, 2023 to September 14, 2023 for the Pine Creek Ridge Road Improvement Special Assessment District. (Roll Call)

#### **Member Discussion**

Ms. Skolarus stated there was a poor turnout for the May election. There were only 30 in-person voters.

Supervisor Rogers addressed the comments at the Call to the Public. The IT department determined that there were 10,000 clicks on the post on Nextdoor, but that does not mean the post was read in full each time; it just means that it was clicked on. Of the 132 responses to the post, 17 of them were Township residents and 43 of the comments were made by Mr. Skarjune. He has not received any phone calls from residents regarding this issue. He noted there is a dedicated officer for the Township to work with the residents and the schools. Additionally. Green Oak Township, Hamburg Township, The City of Howell, the City of Brighton City all have police departments. Michigan State Police also has a post in Brighton Township.

Ms. Hunt stated that she viewed the post many times as she wanted to read the comments. She did not infer that there are a lot of residents in favor of this. The article had all the Board Member's phone numbers, and she did not receive any calls. It also listed tonight's meeting, and no one attended and spoke.





Not just acknowledging its importance but demonstrating it through simple things such as this breif explanation. ASÍA

Fireworks originated in China some 2,000 years ago. The most prevalent legend has it that fireworks were discovered or invented accidentally by a Chinese cook working in a field kitchen, who happened to mix charcoal, Sulphur and saltpeter.

The mixture burned and when compressed in an enclosure the mixture exploded and gave birth to the Firecracker. Firecrackers, both then and now, are thought to have the power to fend off evil spirits and ghosts this accomplished through the loud bangs & bright flashes.

Firecrackers are used in large part to celebrate special events such as births & deaths and continue to gain popularity in the mainstream with the biggest celebration being that of Chinese New Year. Of particular note is the Megastring event at the Pyrotechnic Guild International conference where recently 11 million firecrackers were successfully ignited in a continuous stream.

### EUROPE

Generally, Marco Polo is credited with bringing the Chinese gunpowder back to Europe in the 13th century. Once in Europe, the black powder was used for military purposes, first in rockets, then in cannons and guns. Later fireworks were brought along in the ascetic sense with the introduction of color by the Germans and Italians. The Italians were the first Europeans who used the black powder to manufacture fireworks this during the 18th century. In fact many of the leading American display companies are operated by families of Italian descent when the Grucci, Rozzi, Vitali and Zambelli.

The English were also fascinated with fireworks. Fireworks became very popular in Great Britain during the reign of Queen Elizabeth I. William Shakespeare mentions fireworks in his works and fireworks were so much enjoyed by the Queen herself that she created the position of "Fire Master of England." King James II was so pleased with the fireworks display that celebrated his coronation that he knighted his Fire Master.

## NORTH A MERICA

America's earliest settlers brought their enthusiasm for fireworks to the United States. Fireworks and black ash were used to celebrate important events long before the American Revolutionary War. The very first celebration of Independence Day was in 1777, six years before Americans knew whether the new nation would survive the war; fireworks were a part of all festivities. In 1789, George Washington's inauguration was also accompanied by a fireworks display.

Perhaps the most significant long-term effect North America has had on fireworks was in making them safer for all to enjoy. This was accomplished through the creation of a joint organization now known as the American Fireworks Standards Laboratory. AFSL routinely meets and test fireworks by shooting each item produced in China etc. and determining what the appropriate and correct warning descriptions and print size should be from the point of view of providing safe warning labels for American consumers. Improvements in fireworks safety & quality in North America continue with modern designs and formulations and we see proof of this through improved safety records and dazzling displays. Best of all in the USA we began to see the blending of other forms of entertainment with fireworks bringing us the modern-day Pyro-Musical.

If you are not in the business of providing professional health care services:

- (a) Subparagraphs (1)(a), (1)(b) and (1)(c) above do not apply to any "employee" or "volunteer worker" providing first aid services; and
- (b) Subparagraph (1)(d) above does not apply to any nurse, emergency medical technician or paramedic employed by you to provide such services.
- (2) "Property damage" to property:
  - (a) Owned, occupied or used by,

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**(b)** Rented to, in the care, custody or control of, or over which physical control is being exercised for any purpose by

you, any of your "employees", "volunteer workers", any partner or member (if you are a partnership or joint venture), or any member (if you are a limited liability company).

#### b. Real Estate Manager

Any person (other than your "employee" or "volunteer worker"), or any organization while acting as your real estate manager.

#### c. Temporary Custodians Of Your Property

Any person or organization having proper temporary custody of your property if you die, but only:

- (1) With respect to liability arising out of the maintenance or use of that property; and
- (2) Until your legal representative has been appointed.

#### d. Legal Representative If You Die

Your legal representative if you die, but only with respect to duties as such. That representative will have all your rights and duties under this Coverage Part.

#### e. Unnamed Subsidiary

Any subsidiary, and subsidiary thereof, of yours which is a legally incorporated entity of which you own a financial interest of more than 50% of the voting stock on the effective date of the Coverage Part.

The insurance afforded herein for any subsidiary not named in this Coverage Part as a named insured does not apply to injury or damage with respect to which such insured is also a named insured under another policy or would be a named insured under such policy but for its termination or the exhaustion of its limits of insurance.

The following person(s) or organization(s) are an additional insured when you have agreed, in a written contract, written agreement or because of a permit issued by a state or political subdivision, that such person or organization be added as an additional insured on your policy, provided the injury or damage occurs subsequent to the execution of the contract or agreement.

A person or organization is an additional insured under this provision only for that period of time required by the contract or agreement.

However, no such person or organization is an insured under this provision if such person or organization is included as an insured by an endorsement issued by us and made a part of this Coverage Part.

#### a. Vendors

Any person(s) or organization(s) (referred to below as vendor), but only with respect to "bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of "your products" which are distributed or sold in the regular course of the vendor's business

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and only if this Coverage Part provides coverage for "bodily injury" or "property damage" included within the "products-completed operations hazard".

(1) The insurance afforded the vendor is subject to the following additional exclusions:

This insurance does not apply to:

- (a) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" for which the vendor is obligated to pay damages by reason of the assumption of liability in a contract or agreement. This exclusion does not apply to liability for damages that the vendor would have in the absence of the contract or agreement;
- **(b)** Any express warranty unauthorized by you;
- (c) Any physical or chemical change in the product made intentionally by the vendor;
- (d) Repackaging, except when unpacked solely for the purpose of inspection, demonstration, testing, or the substitution of parts under instructions from the manufacturer, and then repackaged in the original container:
- (e) Any failure to make such inspections, adjustments, tests or servicing as the vendor has agreed to make or normally undertakes to make in the usual course of business, in connection with the distribution or sale of the products;
- **(f)** Demonstration, installation, servicing or repair operations, except such operations performed at the vendor's premises in connection with the sale of the product;
- **(g)** Products which, after distribution or sale by you, have been labeled or relabeled or used as a container, part or ingredient of any other thing or substance by or for the vendor; or
- (h) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of the sole negligence of the vendor for its own acts or omissions or those of its employees or anyone else acting on its behalf. However, this exclusion does not apply to:
  - (i) The exceptions contained in Sub-paragraphs (d) or (f); or
  - (ii) Such inspections, adjustments, tests or servicing as the vendor has agreed to make or normally undertakes to make in the usual course of business, in connection with the distribution or sale of the products.
- (2) This insurance does not apply to any insured person or organization, from whom you have acquired such products, or any ingredient, part or container, entering into, accompanying or containing such products.

#### b. Lessors Of Equipment

- (1) Any person(s) or organization(s) from whom you lease equipment; but only with respect to their liability for "bodily injury", "property damage" or "personal and advertising injury" caused, in whole or in part, by your maintenance, operation or use of equipment leased to you by such person(s) or organization(s).
- (2) With respect to the insurance afforded to these additional insureds this insurance does not apply to any "occurrence" which takes place after the equipment lease expires.

- (2) In the performance of your ongoing operations performed by you or on your behalf.

With respect to the insurance afforded these additional insureds, the following additional exclusion applies:

This insurance does not apply to "bodily injury", "property damage" or "personal and advertising injury" arising out of the rendering of or the failure to render any professional services by or for you, including:

1. The preparing, approving, or failing to prepare or approve, maps, shop drawings, opinions, reports, surveys, field orders, change orders or drawings and specifications; or

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2. Supervisory, inspection, architectural or engineering activities.

This exclusion applies even if the claims against any insured allege negligence or other wrongdoing in the supervision, hiring, employment, training or monitoring of others by that insured, if the "occurrence" which caused the "bodily injury" or "property damage", or the offense which caused the "personal and advertising injury", involved the rendering of or the failure to render any professional services by or for you.

### e. Permits Issued By State Or Political Subdivisions

Any state or political subdivision, but only with respect to operations performed by you or on your behalf for which the state or political subdivision has issued a permit.

With respect to the insurance afforded these additional insureds, this insurance does not apply to:

- (1) "Bodily injury", "property damage" or "personal and advertising injury" arising out of operations performed for the state or municipality; or
- (2) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" included within the "products-completed operations hazard".

#### f. Any Other Party

Any other person or organization who is not an additional insured under Paragraphs a. through e. above, but only with respect to liability for "bodily injury", "property damage" or "personal and advertising injury" caused, in whole or in part, by your acts or omissions or the acts or omissions of those acting on your behalf:

- (1) In the performance of your ongoing operations;
- (2) In connection with your premises owned by or rented to you; or
- (3) In connection with "your work" and included within the "products-completed operations hazard", but only if
  - (a) The written contract or agreement requires you to provide such coverage to such additional insured; and
  - **(b)** This Coverage Part provides coverage for "bodily injury" or "property damage" included within the "products-completed operations hazard".

#### However:

- (1) The insurance afforded to such additional insured only applies to the extent permitted by law; and
- (2) If coverage provided to the additional insured is required by a contract or agreement, the insurance afforded to such additional insured will not be broader than that which you are required by the contract or agreement to provide for such additional insured.

With respect to the insurance afforded to these additional insureds, this insurance does not apply to:

How this insurance applies when other insurance is available to the additional insured is described in the Other Insurance Condition in Section IV - Commercial General Liability Conditions.

No person or organization is an insured with respect to the conduct of any current or past partnership, joint venture or limited liability company that is not shown as a Named Insured in the Declarations.

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# MICHIGAN FIREWORKS SAFETY ACT (EXCERPT) Act 256 of 2011

# 28.466 Articles pyrotechnic or display fireworks ignition; permit; competency and qualifications of operators; retention of fee.

- Sec. 16. (1) The legislative body of a city, village, or township, upon application in writing on forms provided by the department on the department's website and payment of a fee set by the legislative body, if any, may grant a permit for the use of agricultural or wildlife fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, display fireworks, consumer fireworks, or special effects manufactured for outdoor pest control or agricultural purposes, or for public or private display within the city, village, or township by municipalities, fair associations, amusement parks, or other organizations or individuals approved by the city, village, or township authority, if the applicable provisions of this act are met. After a permit has been granted, a permit holder may sell, possess, or transport fireworks for only the purposes described in the permit. A permit granted under this subsection is not transferable and shall not be issued to a minor.
- (2) Before a permit for articles pyrotechnic or a display fireworks ignition is issued, the person applying for the permit shall furnish proof of financial responsibility by a bond or insurance in an amount, character, and form deemed necessary by the local governing authority to protect the public and to satisfy claims for damages to property or personal injuries arising out of an act or omission on the part of the person or an agent or employee of the person.
- (3) The department shall not issue under this act a permit to a nonresident person for ignition of articles pyrotechnic or display fireworks in this state until the person has appointed in writing a resident member of the bar of this state or a resident agent to be the legal representative upon whom all process in an action or proceeding against the person may be served.
- (4) Before granting a permit under this act, the local governing authority shall rule on the competency and qualifications of an articles pyrotechnic and display fireworks operator, as furnished by the operator on the operator's application form, in accordance with the requirements provided under NFPA 1123, and on the time, place, and safety aspects of the display of articles pyrotechnic or display fireworks.
- (5) A local unit of government that charges and collects a fee to issue a permit under this section shall retain the collected fee.

The Brighton Area Fire Authority has reviewed the request to provide a public fireworks display scheduled for July Monday July 3, 2023 on Crooked Lake sponsored by Oak Pointe.

We understand that Genoa has received the application on to approve the Display Fireworks Permit as of May 25<sup>th</sup> and that the largest shell will be 6" in diameter. The application included a site map that shows a 880' separation from the launch site to the shoreline. This separation meets the requirements of NFPA 1123, Code for Fireworks Display, and it will be sufficient as long as there is a means provided to maintain the viewing public this distance away from the launch site. It is recommended that some form of visual and physical barrier be provided to assist with crowd control along with responsible staff to monitor.

The fire authority will visit and inspect the display set-up prior to the scheduled launch time while you are setting it up. We will also review the safety & emergency plan at this time.

Despite the fact that it is slightly newer, the surfaces at the heavier used swings and fitness play areas are showing the most wear. As a result, we initially planned to replace the surfaces incrementally over the next two years starting with the swing and fitness play areas this summer. To replace the surface in these two areas, we received the following 3 quotes:

Given the variation in these quotes, I reached out to a representative at Michigan Recreation who is currently working on the Senior Survivor park playground. Michigan Recreation explained that the difference in the quotes is based on the depth of the surface quoted and the amount of the resin that is used to bind the surface together. For the Survivor Park, Softline Solutions will be installing the poured-in-place rubber surfacing. Michigan Recreation recommends Softline Solutions because they are a well-respected local Michigan company with experienced installers that stand by their work. Michigan Recreation has been using Softline Solutions as their vendor for a number of years due to the quality of their product.

Knowing that Softline Solutions is scheduled to be on-site installing surfacing for the Survivor Park, we asked them review their quote for mobilization efficiencies and cost savings. As hoped, planned mobilization on-site this summer and combining the projects into one represented a large cost savings. We recently received an updated quote from Softline Solutions which includes replacement of <u>all phases</u> of the existing poured-in-place rubber surfacing plus the replacement of the turf in the soccer kick wall area with rubber surface for \$131,178.75. This quote includes removal and disposal of the existing surface as well as duplication of the existing design. Lastly, the company provides a 5-year guarantee on the structural integrity of all surfaces they install. I've attached a copy of the quote in the following pages for your review.

For your consideration at Monday's Board meeting is a whether to replace all the existing surface and approve the quote with Softline Solutions for the full amount. This would also require an amendment to the budget. The budget amendment would be an increase of \$32,000 but would complete the project in a single year rather than divide it over two years. If we decide to divide the project up into half this year and half next year, the additional costs associated with remobilization and reduced scale are estimated to be between \$15,000 and \$18,000. It is my recommendation to take advantage of the economy of scale and approve the quote and amend the budget for the full project. In this regard, I offer the following motion for your consideration:











